

Action Plan half way point reached

It's two and a half years since the implementation of the Kaiāwhina Workforce Action Plan. It's reached the half way point and things are well on track. We're pleased to report that significant progress has been made towards achieving the 56 actions.

- > **All Career Development actions have now been completed.**
- > **13 actions across the Plan have been completed, and**
- > **17 further actions have been substantially progressed.**

Career Development Domain

We're very proud to announce the completion of all actions in the Career Development Domain. The last two actions Action 2.1 and 2.2 relating to Outcome 2: Leadership: Learning and skills development to support kaiāwhina aspiring to leadership roles have now been completed, making this the first domain to have all actions completed.

Leadership and Management Pathways

Kaiāwhina now have access to new pathways to higher learning with the launch of the NZ Diploma in Business (Leadership and Management) Levels 5 and 6. These new training programmes are now available as employment based training through Careerforce, the health and wellbeing sector ITO.
